How can I help at home?

The Reception curriculum sees the children take their first steps on their educational journey. Encourage your children to build on their fine motor skills at home with lots of physical play with their fingers and hands. Grab some playdough, make some bread/cakes and practise with your scissors. These are the first stages to ensure a child is ready to write. Read with your child at home and engage in the pictures you see. Show them words on a page and how they mean something. Encourage them to link events and apply inferential skills. See if they can spot sounds on the page. Allow your child to practise writing their name at home. Encourage them to say the letters' names independently. Spot sounds we are learning in class too. Play lots of number games and encourage the children to count. Play games to order numbers both forwards and backwards. Recognising numbers helps the children to move forward with their maths learning.
